TIMELINE

The Gospel According to Luke was composed more than 5 decades after the death of Jesus. This community was as far removed from the life of Jesus as we would be from 1968 in 2024.



TROUBLESOME STORIES

Of the four Gospels, Luke is the most attentive to including marginalized voices, but that's not a high bar to clear. We do not get extensive details about women like Anna, or Elizabeth, or Mary, and we do not get multiple stories about their lives. Their influence is profound, their witness lasting. But blink, and you may miss them. Give us more, please!
